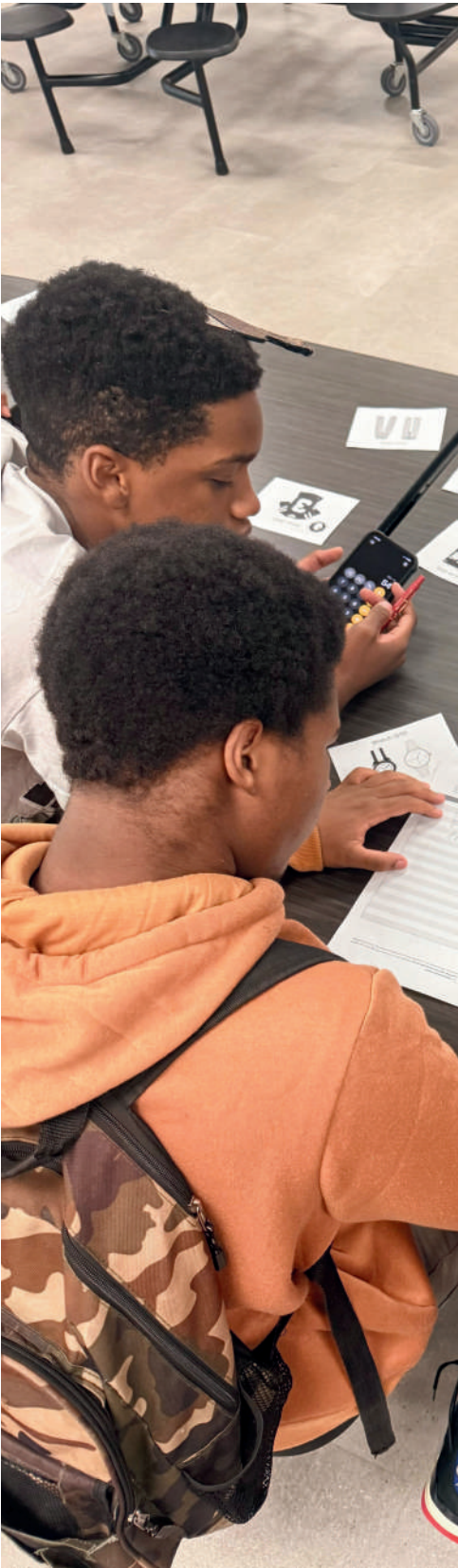

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MESSAGE FROM OUR PRESIDENT & CEO



Dear Friends and Supporters,

Welcome to DREAM Alive's 2025 Annual Report. As I reflect on this past year, I am deeply humbled by the impact we have made together. Our mission—to change lives by mentoring youth toward career paths—remains the heartbeat of our work. We are committed to building authentic, lasting relationships that help young people in Indy discover their dreams and connect them to paths of success. We are grateful to serve as the bridge between passionate companies, community leaders, and the next generation of leaders.

Thanks to your generous support, we expanded our reach and deepened our impact this year. We mentored a record 1,246 youth—an increase of 41%—and provided over 32,291 hours of mentoring, a remarkable 63% growth. Our scholars continue to thrive: maintaining a 99% high school graduation rate, earning GPAs 16% higher than their peers, and showing significant reductions in suspensions and absolutely zero involvement in violence.

Yet, among all our highlights, nothing inspires us more than seeing our alumni return to give back. This year, we joyfully welcomed Anthony Coleman (class of 2020) to our full-time staff, where he now leads as Arlington Middle School's site director on the east side of Indianapolis. Having known Anthony since he was 12, I am quite moved to see him grow into a dedicated leader. Anthony joins Adriana Hernandez (class of 2020), who joined us full time in 2024, as our second staff alumni. These "homecomings" are powerful reminders that the seeds we plant today grow into a legacy of community leaders who pour back into the next generation.

As we look forward to 2026, I humbly ask you to join us in **building a legacy of impact** in our community.

To those who advocate for DA, thank you for your continued investment. To those new to our mission, I invite you to join us. Whether through volunteering, donating, or partnering with us, your involvement will make a lasting difference.

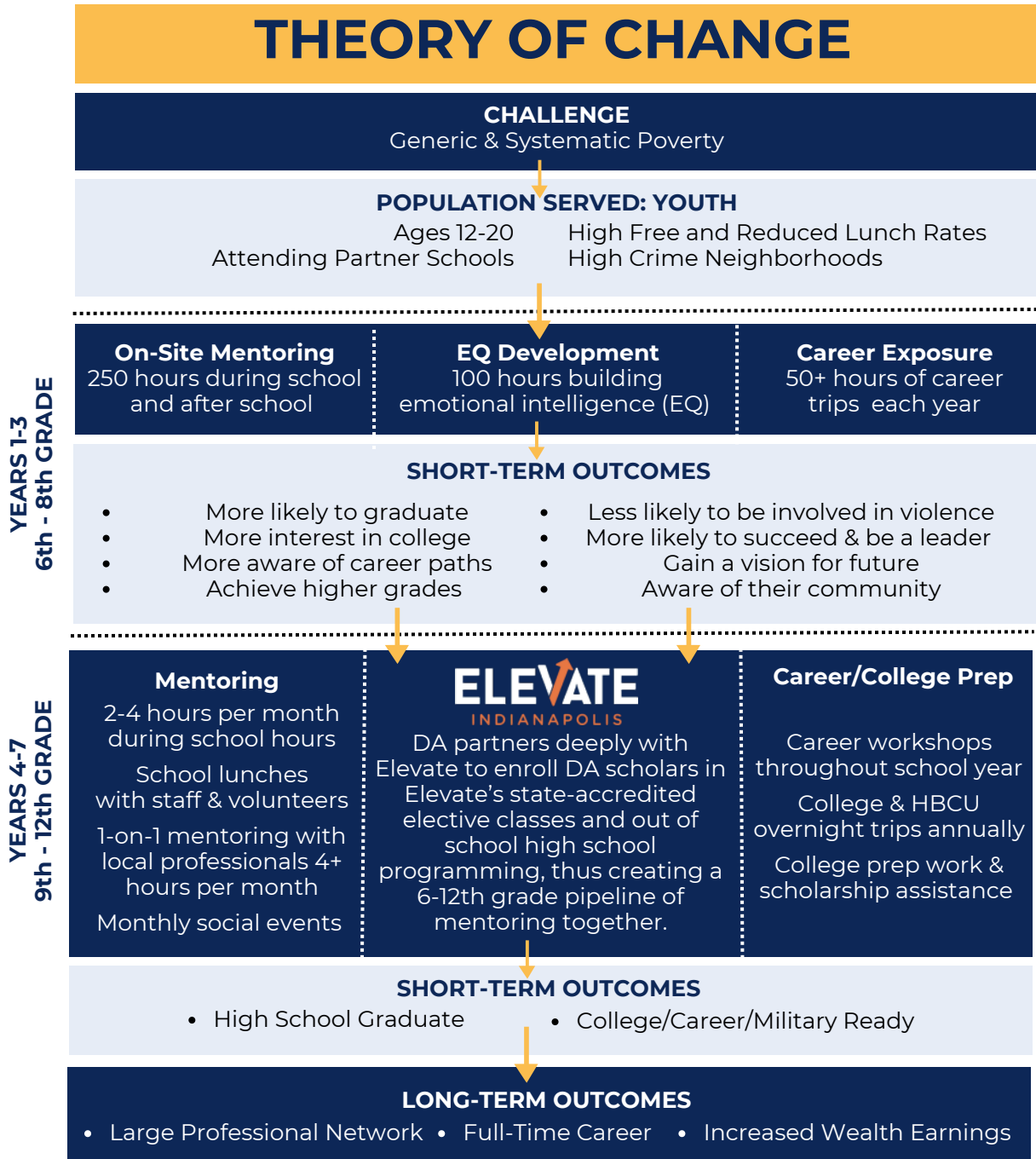

DREAM Alive (DA) is a nonprofit (501c3) which exists to break the cycle of poverty by helping youth discover career paths and mentoring them from 6th grade until high school graduation.

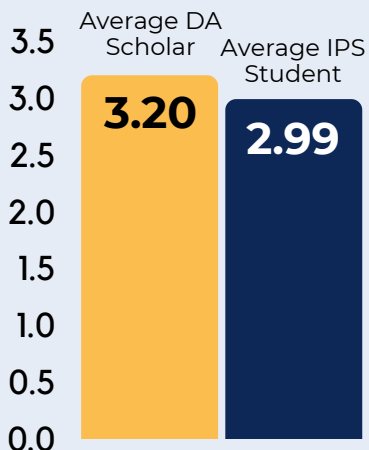

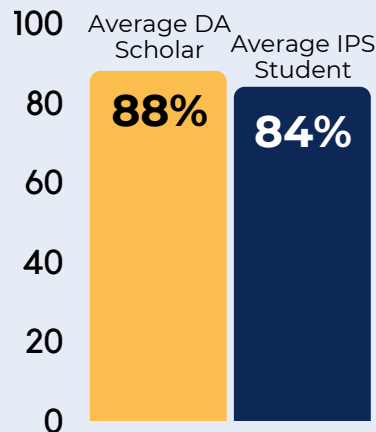

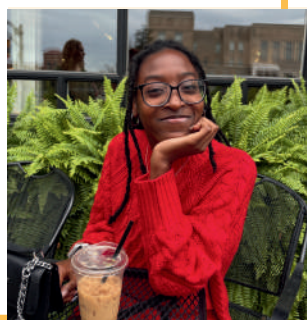

2025 DREAM MAKERS VISION LUNCHEON



\$203,578 Raised

On February 26, 2025, DREAM Alive proudly hosted our inaugural DREAM Makers Luncheon at Victory Field—an inspiring gathering designed to unite supporters who are passionate about empowering the next generation. The event brought together more than 130 attendees for an engaging afternoon featuring lunch, live speakers, impactful videos, and conversations with scholars, principals, and corporate partners.

A highlight of the event was a \$100,000 matching gift from Jim Irsay and the Indianapolis Colts, which energized the room and amplified the generosity of our guests. Thanks to this incredible support and the generosity of our community, we surpassed our \$200,000 fundraising goal—raising \$203,578 for our general operating fund. These funds will directly support the expansion of DREAM Alive’s programs and deepen our impact across Indianapolis.

2025 DREAM AWARDS

The 2025 DREAM Awards, themed *Bright Futures in Full Bloom*, honored 22 award recipients for the meaningful impact they made on our scholars during the 2024–2025 school year. From dedicated volunteers to corporate partners and community leaders, we were honored to celebrate those who continue to make a difference in the lives of our students. The event also recognized our 18 graduating seniors who successfully completed six years of continuous programming with DREAM Alive (even through the COVID years)!

Held once again at the Indiana Farm Bureau Football Center’s Gridiron Hall, each senior was presented with a framed certificate and a backpack filled with donated items, including a brand-new pair of Nike sneakers from New Shoe Day. We are proud to celebrate both our graduates and the community that helps make their success possible.

2025 DREAM CHRISTMAS

On December 17, 2025, the spirit of the season came alive at Gainbridge Fieldhouse as DREAM Alive hosted our 21st Annual DREAM Christmas—a heartwarming tradition that turns the holidays into a beacon of hope for families facing hardship in Indianapolis.

DREAM Christmas empowers our scholars to step into the role of givers, creating an unforgettable “dream” holiday for children and families in need. For five weeks leading up to the event, our scholars dove into hands-on preparation: mastering budgeting skills, thoughtfully shopping for their sponsored child’s wish list, and meticulously wrapping each present.

We welcomed more than 600 guests to this year’s event, providing children and their families with a magical celebration filled with holiday activities, delicious food, and festive cheer.

» CITYWIDE LEVEL-UP: DA LAUNCHES NEW SUMMER PROGRAMS

This summer, DREAM Alive took a bold step forward by co-launching the **Citywide Level-Up**—a transformative mentoring and workforce development program empowering Indianapolis youth ages 12–20. Led by Elevate Indianapolis and DREAM Alive, the initiative united eight additional nonprofit partners across the city: IndyEast Promise Neighborhood, Shepherd Community Center, Camptown, Str8up, Edna Martin Christian Center, John H. Boner Community Center, Latinas Welding Guild, and St. Joseph's of Marian University.

The program delivered tailored experiences for different age groups.

For middle schoolers (6th–8th grade), DREAM Alive led an immersive weekday day camp throughout June, where **143 scholars** engaged in career sessions, company-hosted field trips, outdoor adventures, and even earned a welding certificate. Set on 27 acres near Broad Ripple, the program created a true “summer camp in the city,” complete with lake swimming, canoeing, and unforgettable memories.

High school programming (9th–12th grade), spearheaded by Elevate Indianapolis with support from DREAM Alive staff and partners, emphasized career exploration, vision trips, and outdoor experiences. A total of **139 high school students** participated, including **17 seniors** who earned college credit through Marian University, hosted weekly by St. Joseph's, along with a summer bridge retreat at Bradford Woods to help graduating seniors prepare for what's next.

Together, these efforts delivered **10,739 hours of mentoring** to **312 youth**—a **477% increase** from 2024, when DREAM Alive provided 1,861 hours to 54 youth. With support from **35 local companies**, scholars gained real-world experiences, earned certifications, and built friendships that will last a lifetime.

None of this would have been possible without the collaboration of our partners—especially Elevate Indianapolis, our co-captains in this work. The momentum is building, and we're excited to **run it back in summer 2026**, even bigger and more impactful. Together, we're igniting futures, strengthening our city, and ensuring every young person has the chance to **level up**.

» NBA FOUNDATION RENEWS PARTNERSHIP WITH DREAM ALIVE

INDIANAPOLIS, IN – DREAM Alive (DA) is deeply grateful to announce the renewal of our partnership with the NBA Foundation. Together, we continue our shared mission: opening doors to economic opportunity for under-resourced youth and helping them transition successfully from school to meaningful careers.

This renewed support strengthens DREAM Alive's long-term mentoring program in Indianapolis. Our approach focuses on consistent, authentic relationships and hands-on career experiences, creating reliable pathways to high school graduation and economic self-sufficiency.

Building on past momentum, we've expanded DA's impactful programs to more schools in Indianapolis—including Howe, Longfellow, and Northwest Middle Schools—with the NBA Foundation's generous help. As a result, DA now reaches over 2,450 youth annually (up from 530), and DA scholars consistently show significantly higher grades, engagement, and stronger graduation rates than their peers.

"DREAM Alive gives our youth immersive, hands-on experiences to explore careers they might never have imagined—sparking new dreams," said Tarik Glenn, co-founder of DREAM Alive. "But it's about more than careers; it's about building genuine, long-term relationships right in our neighborhoods. Community mentoring truly makes a difference. We're so grateful for our ongoing partnership with the NBA Foundation—it's not just funding, but a true collaboration to serve our youth together."

Since fall 2025, Camptown has partnered closely with our middle school team, delivering weekly STEAM-focused outdoor learning experiences designed specifically for DREAM Alive scholars. These nature-based sessions emphasize career development in inspiring outdoor settings, adding fresh energy and discovery to our programming. We're so grateful for the exciting new opportunities this has opened for our young people, and we're genuinely thrilled to continue nurturing and expanding this mutually beneficial relationship in the months and years to come.

Another flourishing collaboration is with **Elevate Indy**. We remain deeply committed to partnering with Elevate, particularly as our scholars transition into high school within Indianapolis Public Schools and Purdue Polytechnic Englewood. Together, we're building a seamless, strategic mentoring pipeline from 6th through 12th grade. This past year, our partnership grew even stronger as we joined forces for impactful summer programming—and we're excited to reach and inspire even more scholars through 2026 and beyond.

Finally, we're delighted to spotlight our growing partnership with **New Shoe Day**. While we've collaborated on various projects several times a year since early 2024, this year marked an incredible leap forward. At our annual DREAM Christmas event—hosted by the Pacers at Gainbridge Fieldhouse in December—New Shoe Day provided over 100 pairs of new shoes for recipient families. But the generosity didn't stop there: they also surprised 200 of our 8th-grade DREAM Alive scholars with brand-new Nike shoes as their special holiday gift. We are truly thrilled to partner with New Shoe Day and can't wait to discover even more ways to make a lasting difference together.

While these three partnerships shine brightly in our 2025 story, our hearts are filled with gratitude for **all 27** of our incredible nonprofit partners. Each one has given generously of their time, resources, and passion this year, helping us create brighter futures for Indianapolis youth. Thank you—from the bottom of our hearts—for believing in our scholars and walking alongside us in this vital work. Together, we're making dreams alive!
